Achievements and Outcomes



GP Network

"Collective passion for supporting our community. Proactive networking and sharing information"

- The GP network was developed in 2014 and continues to be a key mechanism for engaging with the partners delivering health and wellbeing outcomes in the south end of the Shire
- The network runs for 1 hour * 4 times a year
- On average 15 attendees
- Internal partners include council staff from Health and Wellbeing, Children & Family Services, Maternal & Child Health, Youth Services and Active Ageing and Disability
- External Partners include Bannockburn Surgery, Teesdale Surgery, Golden Plains Medical Centre, Barwon Health, Hesse Rural Health and Western PHN
- Outcomes of the network in 2019 were increased referrals to allied health services, support of Bannockburn P-12 Breakfast Club, partnership under development for implementation of 'Docs in Schools program', comprehensive list of allied health services developed.





16 Days of Activism Respect Women Call it Out Campaign

A social media campaign that featured 16 community leaders/influencers talking to camera/still shot reinforcing 16 Days of Activism messaging. A video or still shot was displayed on FB or Twitter on the 16 consecutive days finishing with the compilation of all community members.

Key activities and reach of project:

'Super Veggie Four' – Making Veggies Super

The development of the children's book 'The Super Veggie Four' was a collaborative piece, with significant input from Child and Family Services Staff, early years children, primary school children.

Key activities and reach of project:

- Designed to portray vegetables as fun, exciting, and super, the storybook was shaped by families and children from across Golden Plains Shire. It tells the story of three local children from Rokewood, Smythesdale and Cape Clear, who are visited by 'super hero vegetables' and helped in their journey to change traditional family meals from 'ordinary to rainbow,' discovering delicious and healthy vegetables.
- Book launched at 11 kinders across the shire both Council operated and privately owned.
- Book reading and engagement activity held at Council's Children's Week in October 2019
- Reach across two launches :
- Over 600 children aged 3-5 years
- Approximately 300 families across Golden Plains
- This project forms part of a larger project to increase vegetable consumption across the Shire, other reinforcing activities that have occurred include : Winter Harvest Festival in Dereel and Rokewood, 'Taste the Rainbow' campaign that has been picked up by G21 partners and delivered regionally.

Vichealth Walk to School 2019

Annual Vichealth funded program to encourage children and families to be active and walk, ride, scoot to school

Key activities and reach of project :

- **15** Schools signed up to program (100% of schools in the Shire)
- Campaign focused on 'Walk on Wednesday' concept to encourage and support families who may not walk at all to at least walk once a week
- 'Walk on Wednesday' Launch held in Bannockburn in partnership with St Mary McKillop Primary School, Bannockburn P-12 College, GPSC Early Years, Bright Minds Early Learning Centre
- Launch encouraged families to walk one of two main routes to schools where street performers were positioned for entertainment. Large numbers of students and families walked on this day.
- Many of our schools are unable to encourage 'Walk to School' due to rurality , schools in this position were were encouraged to hold weekly walks within there school communities , many of our schools to this approach
- All schools who signed up to the program received two deliveries of fruit in the month of October support their walking activities and reinforce health messaging.
- H&WB Team working in partnership with the G21 Active Travel group to develop a communications plan so that imagery and messaging across the G21 region was consistent, this included community signagage, FB posts, press releases and media articles.
