Argyle Apple – Eucalyptus cinerea

(Austraian native)

The Argyle Apple is a hardy tree that is tolerant to to many conditions. The species has a silver-blue leaf that has great contrast to soft landscapes.

Flowers between May and November with white flowers.





Holm Oak – Quercus ilex (Mediterranean)

The Holm Oak is a slow growing, long lived tree that is tolerant to extended periods of drought an is suitable for temperate regions.

Flowers between March and September with inconspicuous green catkins.





Southern Magnolia – Magnolia grandiflora (South-eastern United States)

The Southern Magnolia is a slow growing, long lived tree that grows in a compact form and broadens with age. The species is tolerant to harsh conditions once established.

Flowers from March through to June with large and grand white flowers.





Kurrajong – Brachychiton populneus (Australian Native)

The Kurrajong has smooth green bark in young trees, which develops into darker bark with large branches as it matures.

Flowers from October through to December with pale green bell shaped flowers.
