Connecting our Community

Project Outline:

We will work to increase opportunities for Barunah Park community members to come together, meet and enjoy activities in each other's company. This will involve supporting an annual Community Celebration along with other events organised by our community.

- We will look to improve the Barunah Park Hall as a welcoming place. This will include improvements to the hall acoustics, which are currently very poor.
- Volunteer working bees, with a BBQ lunch provided.

Benefit to community

By identifying projects where different parts of our community can pitch in, we hope to break down isolation, and ensure all Barunah Park people feel connected to our community.
