Cape Clear, Illabarook and Rokewood Junction Priority Projects 2023-2027

Defibrillator (AED) machine access

Activities proposed include:

Work with the Cape Clear Primary School to move the AED to an external wall so it can be accessed when required as well as training for community members on its use.

Benefit to community:

As a critical community asset, knowing that a working defib machine is accessible and ready to use creates peace of mind for our residents who do not have a doctor or hospital close by. It reduces the need for multiple phone calls to activate the CFA truck and access the School after hours.
