The Growing Places Strategy is a plan for where housing and population growth could be supported to 2050 and beyond.

Victoria is growing and the State Government is setting housing targets for each municipality to carry its share of growth.

WHAT DOES THE DRAFT GPS DO?

Based on the stakeholder and engagement findings and further research undertaken, the new growth scenario:

• Identifies five key Potential Growth Locations and the preconditions required to support that growth.

- Continues to support existing plannied growth, including growth already planned for in Bannockburn.
- Supports additional growth in Meredith, Lethbridge and Teesdale.
- Identifes Meredith as a future stand-alone service-based hub, if and when reticulated sewerage becomes available.
- Cambrian Hill and Stonehaven are considered suitable options for future growth when infrastructure is available.

The draft GPS provides certainty for the future. With an evidence based, long-term plan in place, Council is ready to ensure well planned, throughtfully sequenced growth.

HOW HAS THE PLAN BEEN DEVELOPED?

Developing the GPS - six key stages:

Stage 1: Background research

Stage 2: Developing the Informing Document and testing a future growth scenario

Stage 3: Preparing and consulting on a draft GPS and action plan



Stage 4: Adopting a final GPS

Stage 5: Preparing and consulting on a Planning
Scheme Amendment to incorporate the GPS
into the Golden Plains Planning Scheme
(the 'rule book')

Stage 6: Submitting the Planning Scheme Amendment to the Minister for Planning for final approval.

WHAT WE HEARD IN STAGE 2

Mid last year Council released the Growing Places Informing Document and a draft 'future growth scenario' to discuss with the community. The Informing Document summarised the evidence based research to put Council on the front foot to carefully plan for growth.

We received valuable feedback from extensive engagement with stakeholders and the community highlighting three key concerns; traffic and transport; the timely supply of supporting infrastructure and services; and protecting the Shire's country feel.

Since then, final research and technical studies have been completed. Together, these insights have shaped the draft Growing Places Strategy and some things have changed as a result.

This includes:

- Focusing growth in areas where supporting infrastructure already exists. (e.g. Bannockburn Growth Plan).
- Keeping Cambrian Hill and Stonehaven in the scenario but without timeframes and triggered only when infrastructure becomes available in the future.
- Consideration of Plan Victoria targets.

Ultimately, it's about directing the right housing to the right places in a way that delivers net benefits to current and future communities, and preserves the Shire's valuable assets and country feel.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

This is a draft Strategy, no final decisions have been made and we will be seeking feedback from the community after the Council elections.

Developing and implementing the GPS will take time and involves many different players.

Council's role is to develop the plan for where housing can go, and include it in the planning rules. The State Government, and the Minister for Planning, needs to agree with our plan before we can do this.

Once approved and incorporated into the Planning Scheme, there are several steps involved in implementing it including:

- Preparing more detailed township-based implementation plans, called Structure Plans, that show 'how' growth will be accommodated
- Economic development assessments
- Environmental and sustainability plans
- Advocacy and funding requirements

Implementing the GPS is a long-term process and will not happen for some years.
