COMMENCEMENT OF NEW REQURIEMENTS FOR SWIMMING POOLS AND SPAS

On 1 December 2019, amendments to the *Building Act 1993* will take effect that require all local councils to establish a register of swimming pools and spas located within their municipal districts.

The Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) is currently finalising Regulations in relation to swimming pool and spa barriers. Amongst other things, the Regulations will impose mandatory obligations on land owners to register their swimming pools and spas with council.

A draft of the proposed Regulations was released in late July 2019 for public consultation. Many councils provided responses to the consultation process and this strong engagement was greatly appreciated. DELWP is considering the feedback provided by councils and other stakeholders as it works to finalise the new requirements. This includes consideration of potential changes that take into account stakeholder views regarding costs and implementation timeframes.

DELWP will advise the Minister for Planning on proposed changes to the Regulations in response to the issues raised through consultation. The Minister for Planning will decide what is included in the Regulations and will make formal recommendations to the Governor in Council.

To assist councils to prepare for the new requirements, DELWP is providing advance notification of the information that is likely to be required to be kept on council registers:

- Owner's name, address where the pool or spa is located and whether the pool or spa is relocatable.
- The date of construction determined by council, and what the applicable barrier standard
 is
- Compliance certificate (most recent, if issued): The date it was issued, the registration number
 of the inspector who issued it, and a record of whether the inspector has indicated that they
 carried out building work on the barrier before issuing the certificate.
- Non-compliance certificate (if issued): the date the certificate was issued, and the registration number of the inspector who issued it.
- Compliance dates: date that any exemption was granted relating to owner's provision of the
 first compliance certificate, when the next barrier compliance certificate is due, and dates and
 building permit numbers of any work that altered, modified or replaced the barrier after the date
 of construction.

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DELWP is committed to working with local government stakeholders to ensure smooth and successful implementation of the new requirements. Further information will be provided to councils and other stakeholders once the final regulations have been made.
