To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing regarding the proposed composting facility for Bannockburn, VIC. As residents of Bannockburn, my family, friends and I are deeply concerned about the plan to accept up to \$2,000 cubic meters of waste including abattoir waste, poultry manure, batchery waste, and grease trap waste in our lown. This is a eategory 4 composting facility which poses the highest level of risk to human lealth and the environment. As-Bannockburn is one of the largest growth areas in Victoria, this is not an ideal area to place such a facility. We are extremely concerned about

- . The health risks of having category 4 waste driven through and collected within such close proximity to our residences and town centre.
- The noxious odour from the facility itself and from the immense number of trucks and trailers that will be possing through so close to our residences and on our main road.
- The increased traffic and reduced safety that will result from the immense number of trucks and traffers on our main road in and out of town. This is our only available route. Our main and only route through town would become an industrial gardage route that is open 7 days a week.
- The increase in noise in our country town resulting from trucks and machinery.
- The unsightliness of a category 4 composting facility in view of our main road.
- Dangerous materials may be on the wheels and outside of tracks or may fall from the tracks and traders in our main areas on their way. through posing a threat to our residents and animals and giving off a noxious odour.
- · The proximity of this facility to our town and residences. The proposed size of this facility and mass amount of high risk waste is not something that any of us are comfortable baving within such a classe proximity.

We feel that this facility would severely impact the lives of the current residents of Bannockburn in addition to severely impacting the appeal of Bannockburn for those considering the move to our clean, quiet, accessible town

We sincerely hope that the plant for such this composting facility will not be approved.

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

To whom it may concern,

I wish to lodge a formal objection against the proposed BANNOCKBURN, P19-081 - 607 BANNOCKBURN-SHELFORD RD (COMPOSTING FACILITY) by Advanced Composting Technologies of Australasia Pty Ltd (ACTA).

Teesdale and Bannockburn are rural areas and this type of industry does not belong in a rural area. The fire hazard alone, should be sufficient to reject the application, it is unbelievable the CFA has approved the proposed facility as safe!

The disastrous failure of the Broderick Road site at Lara should be used as an example by Golden Plains Shire Council to reject the proposed composting facility.

With one person on site at the proposed Bannockburn facility, how can the Council and EPA guarantee no dangerous substances such as Asbestos will be dumped at the site? There will be no control on what is dumped putting the health of all Teesdale and Bannockburn residents at risk.

### The piles of compost will be up to 4m high - the site plans to accept:

Poultry Manure up to 5,000m3 /year: Only poultry manure in the form of litter from poultry farms will be received at the site. The compost facility is designed to receive up to 5,000m3 /year.

Grease Trap Waste up to 10,000m3 /year: Grease trap waste is classified as a liquid waste as its liquid content is in the range of 85 = 95%. The main sources of grease trap waste are commercial food processors, restaurants, hotels, cares, etc. The compost facility is designed to receive up to 10,000m3 /year Hatchery aste flatchery waste consists of eggshells, egg vokes, egg white and chicken embryos. It will be sourced from chicken hatcheries.

Abattoir Waste Abattoir up to 5,000m3 /year The compost facility is designed to receive up Abattoir Waste Abattoir 5,000m3 /year to waste consists of a combination of liquid and solid waste residue from wash down activities within abattoirs.

Traffic Depot activities shall be managed to minimise the affect of traffic arising from depot activities on the local community. According to their own forecast: this will be approximately an extra 1,730 truck movements per year on the road, (in addition to the logging trucks already using the Shelford-Bannockburn Road as a shortcut). The Shelford-Bannockburn Road is poorly maintained road and will not cope with this extra heavy vehicle traffic. Residents don't even get a relief from the Trucks on a Saturday and Sanday! Operating hours for the depot are: - Monday to Friday, 7.00 am - 5.00pm - Saturday, 7.00 am - 5.00pm - Saturday, 7.00 am - 5.00pm - Saturday, 7.00 am - 4.00 pm - Sunday, 10 am - 4 pm.

This is a privately run dump site and the Depot Manager is South Australian based? How does this benefit Golden Plains and Victoria in any way? Is Teesdale/Bannockburn to become a dumping ground for all of South Australia and Victoria?

The Council should not approve this composting facility.

What will the improvements to the road be to accommodate the traffie flow and entry and exit of vehicles to the site?



Regarding: BANNOCKBURN, P19-001 - 607 BANNOCKBURN-SHELFORD RD (COMPOSTING FACILITY) environmental concerns

Further to my letter on 30-4-2019 I wish to raise additional concerns regarding this site.

What happens if local wildlife access the site ingest the materials, carry materials offsite? We have a range of native wildlife living in the area, not limited to echidnas, kangaroos, wallables, many bird species and raptors that feed on carrion. I seriously hope this kind of facility would not impact upon what they would ingest.

Also the minor works pollution abatement notice that was issued stated that the company:

Did not comply with the cessation of the trial on 2 Dec 2017, as deliveries were received up to 8 Dec 2017. The inspectors "detected a very strong putrid/ dead animal and rotting organic odour". It was noted that there was a "large quantity of chicken mortalities, plastic and green waste". There was no screening of stockpiles (which were 5m high). Approximately 3000L of grease trap waste was delivered the day prior to the EPA inspection and a brown fatty liquid waste was leaching outside the bunds and flowing down the gradient.

If the company cannot comply even in the initial trial, given that it continued to receive deliveries after the end date, this gives me next to no confidence that they will comply with the regulations set.

No thanks, I do not "putrid" dead animal odour" to be the greeting to my home town

Why was there plastic in the compost?!!! This is meant to be a composting facility!


