
FROM THE **MAYOR**


FEDERAL FUNDING GETS BANNOCKBURN HEART BEATING

Council has been successful in securing \$1.2 million in Federal Government funding for the Bannockburn Civic Heart Precinct.

The funding, announced by Sarah Henderson MP, Federal Member for Corangamite on 5 October, will help create a vibrant community space next to the existing Bannockburn Library and Cultural Centre. The Heart will include an adventure play space including water play features for children and families, a paved plaza for events and gatherings, public toilets and a BBQ area and much more.

The community will have an opportunity to provide input into what the Heart will look like once the community consultation starts in 2017.

\$2M FUNDING FOR ROAD SAFETY UPGRADES

The Federal Government has confirmed Golden Plains Shire Council will receive \$2.075 million in blackspot funding.

The funding is being provided under the Federal Government's Infrastructure Investment Program and will address four projects which were identified by Council through road reviews and community feedback.

The road safety projects to be carried out in Golden Plains are a 700m section of Ross Creek-Haddon Road, a 3.4km section of Smythesdale-Snake Valley Road, 2.5km section of Sebastopol-Smythesdale Road and a 2.3km section of Meredith Steiglitz Road.

Council is pleased that Golden Plains' voice has been heard; this funding confirms the value of our comprehensive lobbying and advocacy with the Federal Government.

Members of your new look Council for Golden Plains Shire took their Oath of Office on Tuesday 8 November following the Victorian Electoral Commission's official declaration of the 2016 Local Government election results on 2 November.

At the same meeting, Councillors voted Cr Des Phelan to lead them as Mayor for the next year.

The make-up of Golden Plains representatives will include three returning councillors

Cr Joanne Gilbert (new)

Joanne believes community consultation is paramount and is strongly committed to improving infrastructure and services. Born and raised in Napoleons, Joanne lives in Cambrian Hill with her family and is an active member of her community.

Cr Owen Sharkey (new)

Owen lives with his family in Batesford, where he is involved in the community, and works in Bannockburn. He would like to be seen as an approachable councillor whose decisions benefit the whole of the Shire.

Cr Helena Kirby (returning)

Helena is a longstanding Councillor, living and working in Rokewood. She is a voice for the whole of the Shire and has helped achieve many positive outcomes. Helena's key priorities are to improve infrastructure and keep rates at a minimum.

Cr David Evans (new)

David is a Bannockburn resident and is passionate about making Golden Plains' rates fair and equitable and is interested in making budgetary cost savings, wherever possible.

Cr Nathan Hansford (returning)

Nathan is returning as a Councillor for his second term. Nathan lives in Bannockburn with his family, owns a local business and is committed to making the Shire an even greater place, and is focused on ensuring services are maintained or improved.

Cr Des Phelan (Mayor, returning)

A farmer from Springdallah, Des has represented the community as Mayor for the last two years. Des is committed to enhancing opportunities for community consultation and keeping rates at a minimum whilst maintaining roads at optimal levels.

Cr Les Rowe (new)

A life-long Golden Plains resident, Les owns and operates a business in Sutherlands Creek. Les is active in his community and lobbied for the new Bannockburn K-12 school. Les is committed to supporting Golden Plains residents, ratepayers and community organisations.

HELP KIDS SURVIVE THE HEAT

It's important to consider how you can look after yourself and your kids with summer approaching.

The risk of heat stress is higher for young children, as they sweat more quickly than adults and they are less likely to be able to tell you they are dehydrated.

Make sure they are drinking water rather than sugary drinks and if you're worried they might be dehydrated, ask when they last went to the toilet. A few hours means they're not drinking enough, over six hours means they are likely to be dehydrated.

BUSHFIRE SMOKE CAN AFFECT YOUR HEALTH

Bushfire smoke reduces air quality and may affect people's health.

How smoke affects you depends on your age, existing medical conditions such as asthma or heart disease, and the length of time you are exposed to the smoke. Signs of smoke irritation can include itchy eyes, sore throat, runny nose, coughing and wheezing. Healthy adults who have a short exposure to smoke usually find that these symptoms clear up once they are away from the smoke.

COUNCIL'S ROLE IN EMERGENCY RELIEF AND RECOVERY

The relief phase of an emergency aims to provide the essential needs to individuals, families and communities in the immediate aftermath of the emergency.

The recovery phase aims to assist people and communities affected by emergencies to function effectively.

Council will take the lead in delivering 'on the ground' relief and recovery services as we are the closest to an affected community.

Non-government organisations and volunteers also play vital roles in supporting affected communities, utilising their pre-established community connections to deliver services during and immediately after emergencies.

WEEDS: CHILEAN NEEDLE GRASS

Chilean Needle Grass (Nassella neesiana) is one of Australia's worst weeds.

The species is difficult to identify and the best time to identify the species is in spring when its distinctive purple seed heads are visible.

Needle Grass can be confused with native grass species which have a similar appearance and so care must be taken to ensure the correct identification. For more information check out the Chilean Needle Grass website at www.weeds.org.au/WoNS/Chileanneedlegrass/

- ensures animals and animal welfare is better considered before during and immediately after emergencies, and
- applies to all hazards across the State, in line with the new emergency management framework for Victoria.

ETHBRIDGE AIRPORT FUEL UPGRADE



Lethbridge Airport now has a permanent aviation fuel supply thanks to a \$225,000 grant from the Federal Government's National Stronger Regions Program. The \$450,000 project, which has delivered 4 new fuel tanks, 3 self-service bowsers and a self-service payment unit, was officially opened by Sarah Henderson MP, Federal Member for Corangamite on 5 September.

The new fuel supply supports an already growing aviation industry at Lethbridge Airport as well as providing further opportunities for businesses in commercial aviation, tourism and other support industries.

The project means that the airport now has the capability to supply fuel to both Air Ambulance and CFA aircraft, boosting the ability of these aircraft to service Western Victoria.
