About the data profile:

This provides a collation of datasets around measures impacting on health and wellbeing in Golden Plains Shire and includes:

- 1. Population overview
- 2. Data relating to four health and wellbeing themes:
- Promoting healthy and connected communities
- Enhancing local economies
- Managing built and natural environments
- Delivering good governance and leadership

Data notes:

• This data is drawn from across the four environments the Victorian Government's Environments for health framework for public health planning identifies as impacting on health - social, economic, natural and built. This approach promotes the importance of incorporating health planning into whole-of-council planning.

• Some of the data are "indicators" (i.e. not from whole population surveys) and are subject to the validity constraints identified in the source. These may require further investigation.

• This profile presents the latest available data for each dataset. Currency of data should be considered. Census data is 2016 with results becoming progressively available from 2017. Included datasets are updated from time to time - consult the sources indicated for any subsequent updates. Certain indicators, especially for the VPHS, are no longer collected

• A comparison with the Victorian average and the ranking of Golden Plains within the 79 Local Government Areas is provided where available.
