How was this Plan developed?

Preparation to develop this community plan commenced in April 2017. The Haddon community were asked for ideas and projects via a survey distributed to each resident. 34 surveys were then collated.

A public forum was then held on the 28th of May at which those present (22 residents) voted to establish the top priorities for the Plan. Additionally, those who were unable to attend the forum were given an additional opportunity to vote for their top 3 priorities from all of the collated suggestions.

From this process the following 8 Projects were established as the priorities for the Haddon Community Plan 2017 – 2020.

2017-2020 Community Plan Key Projects

Upgrade Lions Park

Work in partnership with Haddon Lions Club to upgrade Lions Park for such things as:

- Fenced off area from river (safety for children)
- Beautification
- Playground
- Lighting for BBQ
- Paths

SEED funding allocated: \$2,000



Road Safety

- School crossing on Sago Hill Road at Haddon Primary School
- Review the appropriateness of speed limits in township

Walking / Riding Tracks

- Tracks for walking or riding to enable kids to ride to school safely and for people to access recreational areas
- A track for walking or riding along Blackberry Lane and Haddon School Road

Communication

Improve communication in Haddon including such things as:

- Noticeboards
- Promotion of events
- Facebook pages
- What's on board
- Newsletters
- Welcome Sign

SEED funding allocated: \$2,000

Rail Trail Amenities

Secure amenities for the rail trail including such things as:

- Pergola / Shelter
- Seating
- BBQ area
- Shelter
- Playground
- Toilet upgrade
- Beautification

SEED funding allocated: \$2,000

Community Garden / Space

Developing a community garden / community space to include:

- Fruit tree garden
- Herb garden
- Vegetable garden
- Community space

SEED funding allocated: \$500

Skate Park Upgrade / A BMX Track

- Upgrade/ extension to the skate park due to overcrowding & popularity
- A BMX track

Social Events

Bring people together for fun activities / community events

SEED funding allocated: \$1,000
