How was this Plan developed?

Preparation to develop this community plan commenced in March 2018. Rokewood and Corindhap communities were asked for ideas and projects via a survey distributed throughout the community in April / May 2018.

28 surveys were completed with over 100 suggestions provided. A public forum was held on the 25^{th} of May at which approximately 26 people attended, further suggestions were made and then those present voted to establish the top priorities for the Plan.

From this process the following 9 Projects were established as the priorities for the Rokewood & Corindhap Community Plan 2018 – 2021.

2018-2021 Community Plan Key Projects

Lagoon

Maintain, upgrade and make improvements to the Lagoon ensuring the historic value of the site is retained.

SEED funding allocated: \$1250

Community Activities / Initiatives

Support current initiatives and implement a range of new community activities such as:
