



'Save the Date' Project.....

Share your stories and help document life at home under COVID 19 self-isolation and social distancing rules.

We invite you (artists, individuals, community groups) to nominate a date in the month of May and submit a digital diary entry for that day. Each creative response may take any form, but must be suitable to be broadcast over the web – this could be a short film, animation, spoken word piece, poem, dance, performance, music – anything at all as long as it can be broadcast online and made under the current rules of social distancing and isolation.

Just want to watch? You can do that too!

Daily diary entries will be uploaded/approved every 24 hours to the new Golden Plains Arts & Culture Facebook Page as an online exhibition that represents COVID 19 life in Golden Plains Shire. Audience members can use the posts comments to engage with the artists by asking questions, sharing posts, or just taking part in the conversation. How to Participate

STEP ONE: Email: arts@gplains.vic.gov.au for a project fact sheet and Facebook help sheet, and begin creating your product (video, artwork, poem etc). You can either upload this directly to the Facebook page or you can email arts@gplains.vic.gov.au to have content uploaded on your behalf (if you're not as confident using Facebook or your internet connection is not great, then this could be an option for you).

STEP TWO: Encourage your family, friends and followers to share and like your post!

STEP THREE: A limited number of participants (up to three) may be offered small grants to continue to work on their chosen piece/ project (up to \$1000).

STEP FOUR: Post COVID-19 social distancing restrictions, we plan to curate a small exhibition of project content to tour the shire (physically!). It is envisaged that this might occur in 2021. In the meantime, you can of course follow the project on the Facebook page.

On to the boring stuff...

- All content will be moderated by the exhibition coordinator and may be withheld from publication to the Facebook page if content is deemed inappropriate. There is no appeal process for this process and the Project Coordinator's decisions will be final.
- The act of uploading your content to the Arts & Culture Facebook page, or by requesting assistance/providing content to publish content to Facebook (via email etc) is understood as consent to the use of your contribution for other project-related exhibits (digital and physical) and project-related promotional activities. It should be understood that the use of social media as a platform may lead to the broad distribution of your content via 'sharing' and downloading of material.
- Should Council offer you a small grant opportunity, terms and conditions will be negotiated separately to this agreement
- All content offered for inclusion in the project must observe required COVID-19 Social Distancing restrictions
